MR. NAN SU

"Secrets Behind The China Economy"

Mr. Nan Su is a reporter and news commentator for the Sound of Hope, a global, non-profit provider of radio news, headquartered in San Francisco. Chinese immigrants established SOH in 2003, and Mr. Nan Su has been there since its creation as commentator as well as an activist for China human rights. SOH transmits shortwave broadcasts inside China to help satisfy the demand for independent information, sharing a wide range of national and international news and events.

In addition to his media work, Mr. Nan Su is a human rights activist who emigrated to the U.S. from China in 1989. He was one of the coordinators of Human Rights Torch Relay in 2008. Starting from Athens, Human Rights Torch Relay spanned from July 2007 to July 2008, with stops at more than 100 cities around the world in order to raise international awareness of China's human rights situation.

Mr. Nan Su holds a Masters degree in Engineering, and has been a professional engineer for over 20 years. He is also an accomplished writer, publishing many short stories, poems, and prose. Married for 22 years, he lives with his wife and two daughters in San Jose, California

Mr. Nan Su's talk reveals the secrets of China's economic growth, and touches upon a profound topic-the cultural change imposed by the regime for the past sixty years and its ripple effects on social, environmental, political and economic aspects of our lives in America.
